
SPRING FLING -- RENEE WEST

AGING IN YOUR OWN HOME -- EDITH MILES (EWMILES@COMCAST.NET)

The Good Neighbors Committee of the Bannockburn Citizens Association (BCA) has been exploring ways to help neighbors stay in their own homes as they age (Age-in-Place). Our program is now underway with volunteers helping seniors.

Survey Results: We have designed a survey to identify senior BCA residents who need assistance and BCA residents who would like to volunteer to help seniors. We have distributed the survey at BCA meetings and through BCA Block Captains. The first 47 surveys were returned from 12 residents under 65 and 35 residents 65 and over. Seven surveyed are over 84. Most of the older residents want to continue living in their own homes as they age. The majority of the seniors welcome visits but do not need help from volunteers at this time. Almost half of those surveyed would like to volunteer to provide transportation, social activities, or home assistance or to run errands. Many of the volunteers are 65 or over. Most of the residents under 65 are very busy with their work and families but volunteer to serve as "back-ups".

Volunteer activities so far: We have visited most of the seniors who said they would welcome "friendly visits" and have discussed their situations and possible future needs. We have arranged several social activities including a holiday party, a luncheon, visits by volunteers, and a table for seniors at the BCA picnic May 17. Our network includes three people with visual disabilities who have shared information and experiences. We have provided transportation to doctors and have run errands.

Preparation of "Resources for Seniors" directory: Because most seniors surveyed said that they would like resources or information on "Aging-in-Place", we have compiled a directory that includes sources of information

for seniors on health and aging, transportation, activities, and recorded books and lectures. The directory has sections on home modification and safety, mobility aides, protection of homes and vehicles from burglary, home health aides, and home services. The directory has been distributed at the last BCA meeting, at the picnic, and by e-mail and is available by request.
