



New Magazine **Venture.** This is

the second issue of the new Bannockburn Banner magazine. BCA has teamed up with N2 Publications to form a new relationship that will include a monthly magazine and various community events. The goal of this venture is to improve our communications and opportunities for neighbors to meet and interact. The new monthly magazine will replace our biannual newsletter, and will have numerous features about our neighbors and community so we can be better informed of events and news. These more frequent community events, as discussed below, will take place in between our quarterly general meetings and spring and fall festivals. # Artist Profile: Jane Pettit By: Timothy Beam

# LET ME START **OFF BY SAYING**


Jane Pettit is a fascinating subject and multiple features on the various facets of her life (and husband Robert Hen-

kin's) may be covered in subsequent issues. This feature attempts to scratch the surface of Jane's artistic background, influences and artistic creations—by including some of her images and artworks within—(although I get the sense there is a vast treasure trove of other pieces at her Gallery in the Frederick area in an old 1825 German Bank Barn).

Jane's art is as impressive as her schedule: Jane chairs the Bannockburn Citizens Association welcome committee (in partnership with Cecily Abram), is on the Board of the Glen Echo Park Partnership for Arts and Culture, the non-profit which runs the arts programs in the park, maintains the buildings and plans for the future.

Jane describes her initial foray into art as being a self-trained folk artist but her many endeavors and experiences have exposed her to many teachers and artistic styles—having attended classes in





Jane's portraits are notable for their three-dimensional elements—seemingly injecting movement and expression into the pieces—she loves to showcase expression and humanity in an inert object. One of Jane's friends noted this artistic style/ quality as being very reflective of Jane's personality—effectively "reaching out" through her art and making an impact on people's lives!

Jane incorporates a Pique Assiette art form to create the 3-dimensional aspect to some of her pieces. (Pique Assiette is a form of mosaic art that uses broken plates and the like arranged in patterns or designs. The name comes from the French piqueassiette, meaning "one who eats from others' plates.")

Jane's artistic influences are seen in her many works – she cites:

1) Kadinsky: an influential Russian painter and art theorist credited with painting the first purely abstract works.

- 2) deKooning: a Dutch-American whose radically abstract style of painting fused Cubism, Surrealism and Expressionism
- 3) Modigliani: an Italian painter and sculptor whose portraits and nudes are characterized by asymmetrical compositions and elongated figures. He was a rival of Pablo Picasso.

Jane's Garden sculpture is phenomenal (and durable) -you'll note some of the pieces in this profile. "The Rose" standing guard at Jane's front door is all about attitude!

As the rose was being constructed Jane needed to counterbalance the weight of the piece—the vision of the lady bug came to Jane as an appropriate balancing act for the piece! Jane describes the construction of the Flower—it is carved out of Styrofoam, then wrapped in fiberglass

mesh, coated in concrete and slathered in thin-set to apply her pique assiette before the final step—grouting—quite a project—and quite a result!

Jane's art has transformed and re-invented itself in new incarnations many times—
Jane notes her pieces tend to be reflective of the different periods in her life.

Today most of her pieces are collagebased and tend to be thematic --diversity is a major theme—she combines divergent or repurposed items together creating art out of chaos. She loves incorporating "found items" and loves the challenge of repurposing objects into her art—she has converted old stair steps into a table and has reimagined a tangle of conduit into a Medusa masterpiece!

Jane would like to invite everyone out to see the Glen Echo Park Art Show in The Stone Tower. It runs from October 25 through November 23 with a meet-the-artists reception in early November. The show includes artistic interpretations by 10 participants from her Italian artist in residence program. Ten artists will be featured—they all used the same ancient lime

and marble materials to produce modern aesthetic and dramatic results!

Jane is a Board member for the Glen Echo Park Partnership for Arts and Culture—following is the Partnership's Mission Statement:

"THE PARTNERSHIP PRESENTS VIBRANT ARTISTIC, CULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL OFFERINGS AT GLEN ECHO PARK AND PROMOTES THE PARK AS A UNIQUE DESTINATION FOR OUR REGION'S DIVERSE POPULATION IT NURTURES A DYNAMIC COMMUNITY OF ARTISTS AND PERFORMERS WHILE PRESERVING AND MANAGING HISTORIC FACILITIES WITHIN A NATIONAL PARK" Impressive!



And the winner is ... The Keefers' beautiful rambler transformed!

Julie Keefer and her husband had a "sinking feeling" about 20 years ago! That is, they were looking into remodeling their home at that time when they discovered it was sinking! Their contractor took notice of separating walls and floors and suspected an underground stream or water pipe damage as the logical suspect.

The contractor, Bruce Preston, immediately undertook a twostage renovation of the Keefers' home. The first stage involved "jacking the home up" to stabilize it and during this renovation phase it was discovered that the shower installation conducted in the 1950s neglected to use a drain pan during initial construction.

This is an interesting discovery since, obviously, someone had discovered this before and instead of installing the drain pan, as indicated, they packed the "void" with various materials; boards, bricks, concrete pieces and the most interesting "fill" material newspapers—interesting because of the archaeological evidence the old papers left behind.

The Keefers were able to "catch up on the news" from the 1950s and actually "dated" their house back to 1953 based upon the still legible newspapers used to prop up their home!

The renovation went beautifully once the correct repair procedures were implemented and the result remarkable!

Julie and husband took a modest 1950's rambler-style home and "opened it up" using every square inch of space to its maximum potential while "adding on" here and there. The most interesting design choice is the matching shape of the second story loft and the deck below—a very interesting choice opening up the modest rambler into an artistic backdrop for their extensive personal art collection and an inviting swimming pool down below! 


increased drama to the magnificent view.

# Resident Recipe PUMPKIN SPICE TRUFFLES!

Pumpkin Spice Truffles are pumpkin-shaped truffles that are bursting with flavor from pumpkin puree, cream CHEESE, CINNAMON GRAHAM CRACKERS, AND PLENTY OF SPICES. THE CREAM CHEESE FLAVOR ISN'T OVERWHELMING, BUT IT DOES GIVE THESE PUMPKIN TRUFFLES A BIT OF A PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE FLAVOR--WHICH IS A DEFINITE PLUS IN MY BOOK! IF YOU WANT TO STAY MORE TRADITIONAL YOU CAN DIP THESE IN REGULAR CHOCOLATE INSTEAD OF MAKING THEM LOOK LIKE MINIATURE PUMPKINS.

- 6 oz. white chocolate, chopped (or use chips)
- 2 oz. cream cheese, room temperature
- 1/4 cup pumpkin puree (not pumpkin pie filling)
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 3/4 cup powdered dry milk
- 3/4 cup powdered sugar
- 1.5 cups graham cracker crumbs (I recommend using cinnamon grahams)
- 1 lb. orange-colored candy coating
- 3 oz. green-colored candy coating



1. In a small bowl, melt the white chocolate in the microwave in short bursts until it is melted and entirely smooth. Set aside for now.

- 2. Combine the softened cream cheese and the pumpkin puree in the bowl of a stand mixer and beat until smooth and combined. Scrape the bowl and beat again to make sure there are no lumps in the cream cheese.
- 3. Add the powdered milk, the powdered sugar, and the pumpkin pie spice. Beat on low until incorporated, then scrape down the mixing bowl and beat on medium speed for 2 minutes, until very smooth.
- 4. Add the melted white chocolate and mix until incorporated. Finally, stir in the graham cracker crumbs.
- The mixture will be fairly soft at this point. Press cling wrap on the top and refrigerate it until firm enough to roll, about 2 hours.
- When the candy is firm, use a candy scoop or a teaspoon to scoop up small balls. Dust your hands with powdered sugar and roll the truffles between your palms to make them round.
- 7. Melt the orange candy coating in a microwave-safe bowl until melted and fluid.
- 8. Dip the truffles in the coating, one by one, using dipping tools or a fork. Set them on a foil-lined baking sheet when finished.
- 9. To make them look more like pumpkins, add a bit of melted chocolate to the remaining orange coating to turn it a darker shade of brownish-orange. Put it in a small plastic bag and snip off a tiny corner. Pipe intersecting lines across the top of the truffles.
- 9. Finish them off with green leaves: melt the green candy coating and put it in a plastic bag as well. Draw a small swirl on to of each pumpkin truffle to simulate vines or leaves.
- 10. Refrigerate the truffles to set the coating, for about 10 minutes, before serving. Store Pumpkin Spice Truffles in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to two weeks, and bring them to room temperature before serving.
