



Lawn&Garden Bannockburn Banner July

With all the produce pouring in from your garden, starting more plants or seeds is probably the last thing on your mind. However, July is the perfect month to start thinking about the fall garden. Many of the vegetables you've enjoyed from the garden this spring and early summer can be grown and harvested this fall as well.



VEGETABLES TO GROW

In most areas of the country, you can easily grow a second crop of many of your favorite vegetables. The first task is to make a

Some of these include lettuce, beans, broccoli, carrots, beets, summer squash, peas, broccoli, cabbage and radishes. In tropical areas you can even grow tomatoes and peppers as winter crops. When looking at varieties, select ones that are fastmaturing to insure a harvest before the cold weather hits.

WHEN TO START

The key to growing vegetables for fall is timing. Vegetables grown in fall need about 14 extra days to mature compared with spring-seeded crops due to fall's shorter days and less intense sunshine. When deciding the date to start your veggies, first determine your average first frost date. Usually the local weather service or Extension service will know that date for your area. Then look at the seed packet for days to maturity. Add 14 days and that will be the date you should start seeds. If you're starting plants such as broccoli and lettuce indoors, add an additional 4 to 6 weeks to account for the indoor growth period.

GROWING ON

Once you have the seeds and dates, remember that sowing seeds or transplants in July or August is stressful on young plants. Protect young seedlings with shade cloth or plant them near taller plants, such as corn or tomatoes that can provide shade from the hot afternoon sun. Add compost to the planting area before planting, moisten the ground, plant your seeds a little deeper than normal and shade the soil so the temperature doesn't get too high. High soil temperatures will inhibit the germination of many vegetable seeds. Another option for greens, such as lettuce and Swiss chard, and cabbage-family crops, such as broccoli and Chinese cabbage, is to grow the seeds indoors under lights and then transplant young seedlings into the garden. Initially transplants will need protecting from the heat, sun and insects, but they are more likely to survive. Use a floating row cover to keep pests away from the plants and keep transplants well watered.

FALL HARVEST

With a little effort in summer, you'll have a splendid harvest of greens, fruits and roots in fall. Some summer-sown crops, such as bean and summer squash, need to be grown and harvested while temperatures are still warm for best quality. However, cool-loving crops, such as kale, lettuce, spinach, and broccoli, will thrive in fall's cooler weather. In addition, you'll be able to extend the harvest time of these crops by using floating row covers or grow tunnels placed over the plants, especially at night. With any luck you'll be eating from the garden until Christmas.

If you've ever spent time hanging artwork in your home, you know that it is not always an easy task. Should you find yourself with a painting, hammer, and no clue where to begin, following a few guidelines will help you create a beautiful display without the stress and guesswork.

ecarroll@allstate.com http://agents.allstate.com/elizabeth-carroll-bethesda-md.html and extra sawtooth picture hangers close by. Be sure that any piece you are planning to hang has a picture hanger or wire attached to it. Not all frames do, so you may have to attach them yourself.

Whether you have one piece of artwork to display, or a cluster of fifteen pieces, you'll want to put some serious consideration into your layout. The most important rule in displaying your artwork is that it should be put at eye level. If your space will allow it, hang pieces approximately 57" from the floor, on center. This height is an eye level average, and a standard that even most art galleries refer to.

STEP BY STEP:

- 1. Measure and lightly mark 57" on the wall
- 2. Measure top of your picture to the middle (or take height and divide by 2)
- 3. Measure top of your picture to the tightened wire (a small amount)
- 4. Subtract this last amount to tell you how far above 57" your hook should go
- 5. Measure up from 57" with this last amount and lightly mark on the wall


EXAMPLE:

- 1. Picture is 20" tall
- 2. Middle is 10" down from top (this should rest at 57")
- 3. Wire comes to 2" below the top
- 4. 10" 2" = 8"
- 5. Lightly mark 8" above your first mark, or 65" on the wall

Once you've determined a general area on your wall for your art display, you'll want to arrange pieces to complement one another. The easiest and most fool-proof way to achieve this is with a literal cheat sheet:

- Arrange all frames on top of a large sheet of butcher or trace paper. Whether you choose to arrange symmetrically or asymmetrically, it is critical to keep a sense of balance in your arrangement. Space pieces two inches apart from one another.
- When you find a composition you are happy with, trace each frame onto the paper. Before removing them, snap a quick photo just in case you forget which piece goes where. Mark the height of each hanger on the paper.
- Use painter's tape to secure the paper on your wall. You may drill or nail directly though the paper into the wall, marking exactly where each piece will be hung. When you remove the paper, you will have a clear map of your layout. Refer to your photo to be sure that each piece is hung in the right place.

Check to be sure your pieces are straight and level. It's a good idea to have some putty and a little bit of your wall paint on hand, just in case you make any mistakes and need to fill in nail holes.

In Rima's own words:

I began my arts career as a ceramist. Many years, and many media (including Plexiglas, neon, steel, cement, wood, paper maché) later, I have returned to clay. It was my first love, and I find it as seductive and satisfying as I did in the beginning. I am now combining it with other organic substances – wood, reeds, vine, stone – to draw on the natural affinity of these materials.

Though my work has been mostly non-representational, my latest major exhibit (The Detritus of Obsolescent Technology) was concerned with both the waste and the ingenuity of our culture. My work always directly or indirectly addresses my perception of a threatening, fragmented world and the need to keep chaos at bay. Thus, my work consistently deals with order and balance, expressed often through the literal deconstruction of mass into precisely related components and through the logical relationship of positive and negative space.

In addition to my creative focus, I have been involved in many social and political causes and with teaching in a variety of venues. My philosophy is egalitarian: I believe that respect and empowerment issues are of prime importance in our society and for the individuals who comprise it. This extends to my art. I want it to be accessible and comprehensible. To that end, I have participated in several art-in-public places programs and have donated many pieces of my work to causes I support, for both fundraising and for enhancing their environments. I believe passionately in the humanizing effect of art and that the more art a community offers its citizens, the stronger the ties within the community.





The budding twigs spread out their fan, To catch the breezy air; And I must think, do all I can, That there was pleasure there

Wordsworth wrote Lines Written in Early Spring while he went for a walk in a spot near the village of Alford, he describes the

moment and the place as a natural scene in motion, branches looking for the sun trying to escape from the water where its tree had fallen and had remained as a natural bridge and water falling down a sloping rock. Through this image we can imagine the sounds and the moment described in the poem.

Wordsworth's real communion with nature is shown in these verses, by his observations and his feelings on the different events, the growing of the periwinkle, the birds' recreation or the branches' breathing and the poet's idea of the ability of these elements to rejoice in their existence as illustrated through his use of personification in these 3 particular stanzas (which seemed strikingly appropriate to illustrate Jane and Finnley's Springtime Exploration through the Bannockburn Estates!).






