

BITE ME CANCER

My daughter, Nikki, was diagnosed with Sporadic Medullary Thyroid Cancer on April 6, 2010, at the age of 17 while she was a junior in high school. I never imagined how inspiring, spiritual and stressful

the journey would be ... or how strong I would have to be as a mom.

At diagnosis, we were told there was no treatment for Nikki's type of cancer other than surgery. While I was very scared, my faith did keep me strong. My husband and I decided to move forward with normal activities, and I kept up a very positive mindset with my daughter. While we may have been happy with normal activities; very quickly, Nikki became focused on going above and beyond expectations. This included giving in when she wanted to set up a Relay for Life team a week after diagnosis (a month before major surgery), and where she raised \$20,000 by the time the Relay event occurred a month after her surgery.

Then, a few weeks after the Relay event, Nikki began begging to have a foundation so she could continue to help others. We were in the middle of critical medical discussions about more surgical options for the cancer, wondering what treatment would bring voice would come back (after losing a vocal cord in surgery), possible external beam radiation that was not a normal treatment option, and getting her ready for her senior year of high school! A foundation wasn't in my plan; but, Bite Me Cancer became

a foundation in September 2010, five months after her diagnosis. Whew!

At diagnosis/surgery, I could not have imagined all that Nikki would accomplish and experience. While she has had cancer throughout the past 5.5 years, has had a variety of surgeries as well as numerous scans, and has been on a new oral chemo since October 2011, she continues to push forward and live with passion and positivity. She was even able to graduate from James Madison University on time in May 2015!

Throughout, she has successfully led Bite Me Cancer to meet its annual goals to raise research funds for Thyroid Cancer (the fastest growing cancer in the country) and also to support/ inspire teenagers battling all cancers. Since September 2010, the foundation has raised almost \$175,000 for Thyroid Cancer research grants and has distributed our special Teen Support Bags to almost 2,000 teenagers with cancer in about 60 hospitals across the country (in 29 states)! We were also able to have the Commonwealth of Virginia institute a Teen Cancer Awareness Week (3rd week of January) each year, statewide, starting in 2015. We have a board of directors and five committees as well as other advisors who help Bite Me Cancer meet our goals, and Nikki leads them all with her vision and commitment.

Throughout our journey with cancer, I have prayed more deeply and have lived a more inspired life. I've tried to focus on the blessings of everyday life, staying in the now, recalculating when needed, and feeling gratitude as much as possible. Nikki has inspired so many people, including me. I go in a hurry, I fall pell-mell down a hill, like a ball of yarn's unraveling trajectory — down and away but also surprising ricochets


that only after seem foretold. Yesterday I took a walk because I wanted to be struck, and what happened was



AUTHENTIC IRISH LAMB STEW

- Traditional Irish Lamb Stew From Country Cork, Ireland

Recipe courtesy of Giana Ferguson

INGREDIENTS

2 medium-sized onions, chopped

Oil, for frying

- 1 ounce butter
- 1 sprig dried thyme
- 2 1/2 pounds best end of lamb neck, cut into large pieces
- 7 carrots, chopped lengthways into 2-inch pieces
- 2 tablespoons pearl barley
- 5 cups chicken stock, recipe follows

Salt (recommended: Fleur du Sel)

Freshly ground black pepper

1 bouquet garni (parsley, thyme, and bay leaf)



1 bunch parsley, leaves finely chopped

1 bunch chives

12 medium potatoes

Serving suggestion: herb butter, recipe follows Made in 30 minutes or less

DIRECTIONS

In a large heavy-bottomed saucepan, cook the onions in oil and butter, on medium-high heat until they are translucent. Add the dried thyme and stir. Add the lamb and brown on a high heat to seal in juices. Add carrots and pearl barley. Pour in the chicken stock so that it almost covers the meat and vegetables. Season with salt and pepper and add Bouquet garni. Cover and cook on low heat for two hours, being careful not to boil. Place potatoes on top of the stew, cover and cook for 30 minutes until the meat is falling beautifully off the bones and the potatoes are fork tender.

Serve the stew in large flat soup bowls, and drizzle herb butter over the potatoes or garnish with parsley and chives.

Stock

Chicken carcass Bay leaf

Salt and freshly ground black 1 onion

4 cups water pepper

3 stalks celery, roughly chopped

Preheat the stockpot. Combine ingredients in a large heavy-bottomed saucepan and cover with water. Bring to boil and simmer for approximately 30 minutes. Then let it cool down and skim off the fat. Yield: 6 servings

Herb Butter

1 stick butter 1 small bunch chives, 1 small bunch parsley, finely chopped finely chopped 1 sprig thyme

Melt butter in a small saucepan. Add parsley, chives and thyme. Yield: 6 servings

re you yearning to get back in the garden but Mother Nature isn't ready? Get a jump on your spring garden by growing seedlings indoors! Growing your own seedlings allows you to save money and grow interesting or unusual varieties of crops and flowers. Veggies with short growing seasons can reach maturity or at least get a good head start by growing inside with controlled conditions and protection from weeds, bacteria, fungi and our hungry furry friends. Planting crops that have already grown indoors results in an earlier harvest and greater yield.

The length of time seedlings need to grow before planting in the garden varies, so consult a growing calendar for your area to determine when to start sowing seeds in your region. Do not plant before the last frost in your area; remember, it is better to plant late rather than too early and watch your hard work wither in the cold.

Before sowing, always read the seed packet for the recommended planting depth and any special instructions, such as pre-chilling or pre-soaking before planting. Select a sterile, "soilless" seed-starting mix, which has a light and fluffy texture and can hold moisture, to help prevent disease and encourage root growth. You can use just about any container with drainage holes to start your seedlings, including something as simple as paper cups with holes punched in the bottom.

To begin sowing, fill containers with your growing mix and moisten with warm water. Scatter the seeds and cover with the mix. A good rule of thumb is to cover seeds with a layer that is three times its thickness. Tap the soil down to eliminate air pockets and gently water. Cover with a clear plastic dome like those sold at gardening centers, or lightly cover with plastic

wrap to retain moisture until seeds begin to germinate. The soil should be moist but do not overwater, which may cause root rot. Be sure to label what you plant and keep the seed packet for future reference.

Once a seedling breaks through the planting mix it quickly runs out of fuel from the seed and begins to use light as its primary energy source. The sunlight in most homes is too weak or insufficient to give seedlings the energy they need, which is the most common reason why planters complain that their windowsill seedlings are lackluster with leggy, spindly stems. Consider supplementing or even replacing window light by using fluorescent bulbs to give your seedlings the light they need to thrive.

Three weeks after shoots are visible, the nutrients in the planting mix are usually depleted and it is necessary to use a liquid fertilizer. If you use a soilless, sterile planting medium fertilizing is imperative. Nourish seedlings with a half-strength fertilizer the first four weeks after germination, and then continue to fertilize with full-strength fertilizer weekly.

Spring will be here before you know it! Sow seeds now to literally reap the benefits later!






